**Claims Exaggeration and Malingering - How to sort them out in Personal Injuries and Workers' Compensation Claims?**

There are few injury claims where no allegation of malingering is expressly or impliedly made during litigation. Literature suggests that treating health care providers often do not consider malingering, even in cases of delayed recovery involving work injuries or other personal injuries, where there may be a significant incentive to feign or embellish symptoms or delay recovery. **Dr. Dorto** in this workshop discusses the evaluation techniques and implications of Claims Exaggeration and Malingering and offers recommendations to evaluating doctors & other professionals.

**Traumatic Brain Injuries, mTBI and Concussion Claims  
How to Evaluate Them?**

Mild traumatic brain injury (mTBI) and its cognitive sequelae (or lack thereof) can be a source of controversy in Personal Injuries and workers' compensation claims. During litigation, allegation of malingering expressly or impliedly are commonly made.

**Dr. Steiman** in this 4-hour intensive workshop reviews multiple conflicting definitions of TBI and mTBI, discusses the evaluation techniques for these claims & implications of current peer reviewed scientific literature and offers recommendations to evaluating doctors and other health care professionals.
